Professor of Journalism and Sociology
Columbia University

Todd Gitlin, is an author, sociologist, communications scholar, novelist, poet, activist and public intellectual. He is currently professor of journalism and sociology and chair of the PhD program in Communications at Columbia University, New York. He has authored fourteen books including, *The Intellectuals and the Flag*; *Letters to a Young Activist*; *Media Unlimited: How the Torrent of Images and Sounds Overwhelms Our Lives*; *The Twilight of Common Dreams: Why America Is Wracked by Culture Wars*; *The Sixties: Years of Hope, Days of Rage*; *Inside Prime Time* and *The Whole World Is Watching*. He was president of Students for a Democratic Society in the early 1960s, and helped organise the first national demonstration against the Vietnam War in the USA. He has written widely for the underground press and has been a member of the Board of Directors of Greenpeace USA.
