## University Review of Postgraduate Education and Research, September-December 2011

The University will embark upon a comprehensive **Review of Postgraduate Education and Research** between September and December 2011. Below follows the covering memorandum explaining the Review, written by Dr Christopher Sarchet, Review Project Manager. I have highlighted extracts from the memo in yellow explicitly referring to research.

The University's Strategic Plan for 2010-13, *Transforming Lives, Meeting Needs, Building Careers*, provides for a series of major reviews including a review of postgraduate education and **research training and a review of research**, knowledge transfer and enterprise activity to be conducted during 2011/12. These two reviews (together with the review of undergraduate education which was completed in March 2011) are the most important reviews that will be carried out during the 2010/13 period of the Strategic Plan.

**The University has agreed to combine the reviews and reduce the timeline to provide a final report by December 2011.**

The Review will examine and recommend upon the broadest range of issues affecting postgraduate education and research, including:

- Student and employer demand
- The shape, purpose and structure of the curriculum
- Modes of assessment
- Formats of learning
- Financial sustainability
- **Research excellence**
- **Research impact**

- Research environment
- Educational connection

In short, the review will seek to determine the most effective, efficient and sustainable ways of delivering the postgraduate programme at London Met and consider fundamental issues concerning the purpose and rationale for research, its connection with the undergraduate curriculum and professional bodies and more importantly, its function in London Met. The University has determined that its research core purpose is its: "...applications through education, knowledge transfer and enterprise activities." In line with the development of the Strategic Plan and the agreed University's Values, a more extensive Project Mandate will be developed and circulated for comment and advice from the University's learning Community in June 2011. The Review will focus on quality and diversity and be conducted in collaboration in an open manner as the other reviews have been.

**The Review Report is to be submitted by 31 December 2011. Recommendations will be implemented during the academic year 2012/13. The Review will issue a progress report by 30 November 2011.**

#### **Terms of Reference**

The Terms of Reference will include, but not be limited to:

1. **Demand:** Examining the data on student demand for London Met courses and how this correlates with the aspirations of our students, as well as the interests of the University's strategic partners.
2. **Curriculum:** Examining the broad configuration of postgraduate education at the London Met, its overarching purposes, and its inherent capacities and the important issues of course and module offerings, capacity/distribution of teaching staff, distribution of research or specialist expertise, timetabling, as well as admission, attrition, assessment and award data.
3. **Assessment:** Reviewing current and potential modes of formal and informal assessment as to their future suitability and utility to students, wherever located.
4. **Pedagogy:** Reviewing current formats of learning, whether in person, virtual or blended, their trends, current levels of learning support, and their utility to students, wherever located.
5. **Funding:** Considering a financial model for postgraduate education at London Met which is flexible, sustainable, compatible with the University's shadow resource allocation model (RAM), provides value for money, and responds proactively to "transparent costing" data.

**6 Research excellence and impact:** A review of the current and prospective evaluative measures of excellence and impact with the identification of performance indicators for the University

**7 Research environment:** Determining the focus of research for the University, its locus and its place in faculty/subject plans.

**8 Education connection:** How can the research conducted at the University be brought into the curriculum for undergraduate and postgraduate taught programmes, how can we actively demonstrate the value of research and scholarship both within the community of scholars and the wider working community and encourage consultancy, Continuing Professional Development and public commentary.

The Review Project Board will meet these Terms of Reference keeping in mind the University's need to provide a full and coherent course portfolio with progression from undergraduate to postgraduate and doctoral programmes, a improve overall student satisfaction, student response to feedback and to teaching, as well as to enhancing employability and minimizing student complaints. **The Board membership will shortly be announced.**

**The University will call for initial submissions from members of the learning community by 15 October 2011, and for submissions in response to the progress report by 15 December 2011.**

It is proposed that the Board shall meet every two weeks for up to 2 hours and work streams will be developed to deliver the core work of the review. Board meetings will be on Thursdays commencing the first week September 2011.

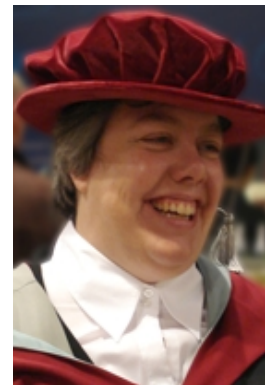

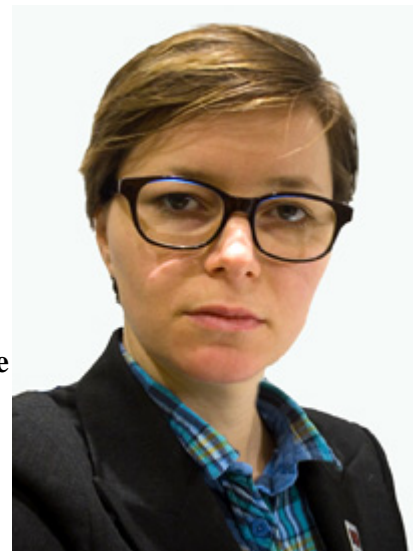

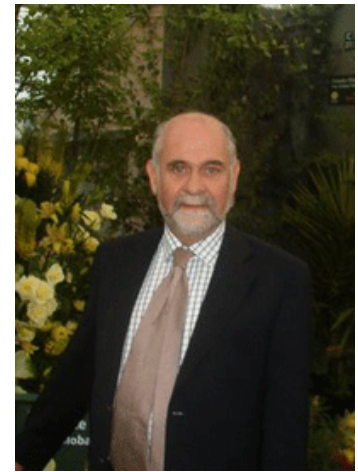
