

MA APPLIED TRANSLATION STUDIES

INFORMATION ON DISTANCE MODE STUDY

Full time mode

Classroom attendance is required throughout the autumn semester then, depending on the option module chosen in the spring semester students can do the rest of the course in distance mode.

To be able to follow the spring semester in distance mode, student have to opt for **Supervised translation project 2** as their option module (see course structure and module description) and will **not** be able to choose Localisation, Subtitling or Introduction to Conference Interpreting as these require classroom attendance.

Part time mode

Classroom attendance is required throughout the first year of the degree then, depending on the option module chosen in the 2nd year students can do the rest of the course in a distance mode.

To be able to follow the spring semester in distance mode, student have to opt for **Supervised translation project 2** as their option module (see course structure and module description) and will **not** be able to choose Localisation, Subtitling or Introduction to Conference Interpreting as these require classroom attendance.

Note for both FT and PT applicants: The last module of the course, the MA dissertation, is a supervised module but also includes a series of 5 crucial research seminars that run in February, April and May. Lecture notes are available on weblearn but we strongly advise those studying in distance mode to do their best to attend these seminars.
