Both artists and business people live and work around our City campus buildings, where skyscrapers rub shoulders with trendy cafés and galleries.

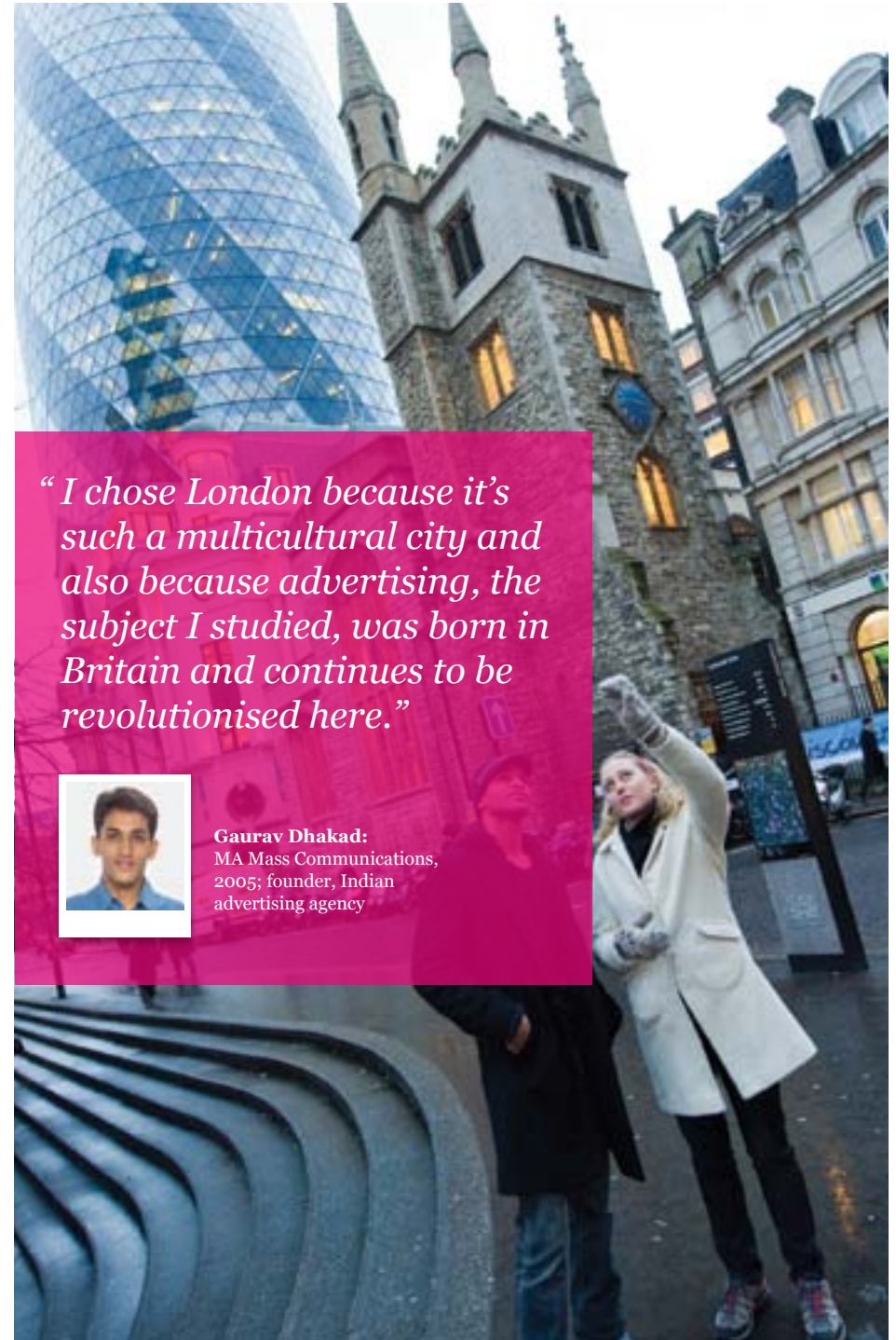
Our North London campus sits within a multicultural community, full of lively bars, beautiful parks and independent shops.

Location

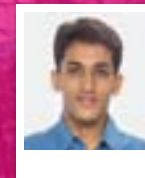
London is amazing. It is a truly 24-hour city, full of history, with an incredible choice of entertainment.

Our Student Services team specialises in giving advice and support. This team can help with accommodation, money management, visas and more. They also offer career advice to help you find a job.

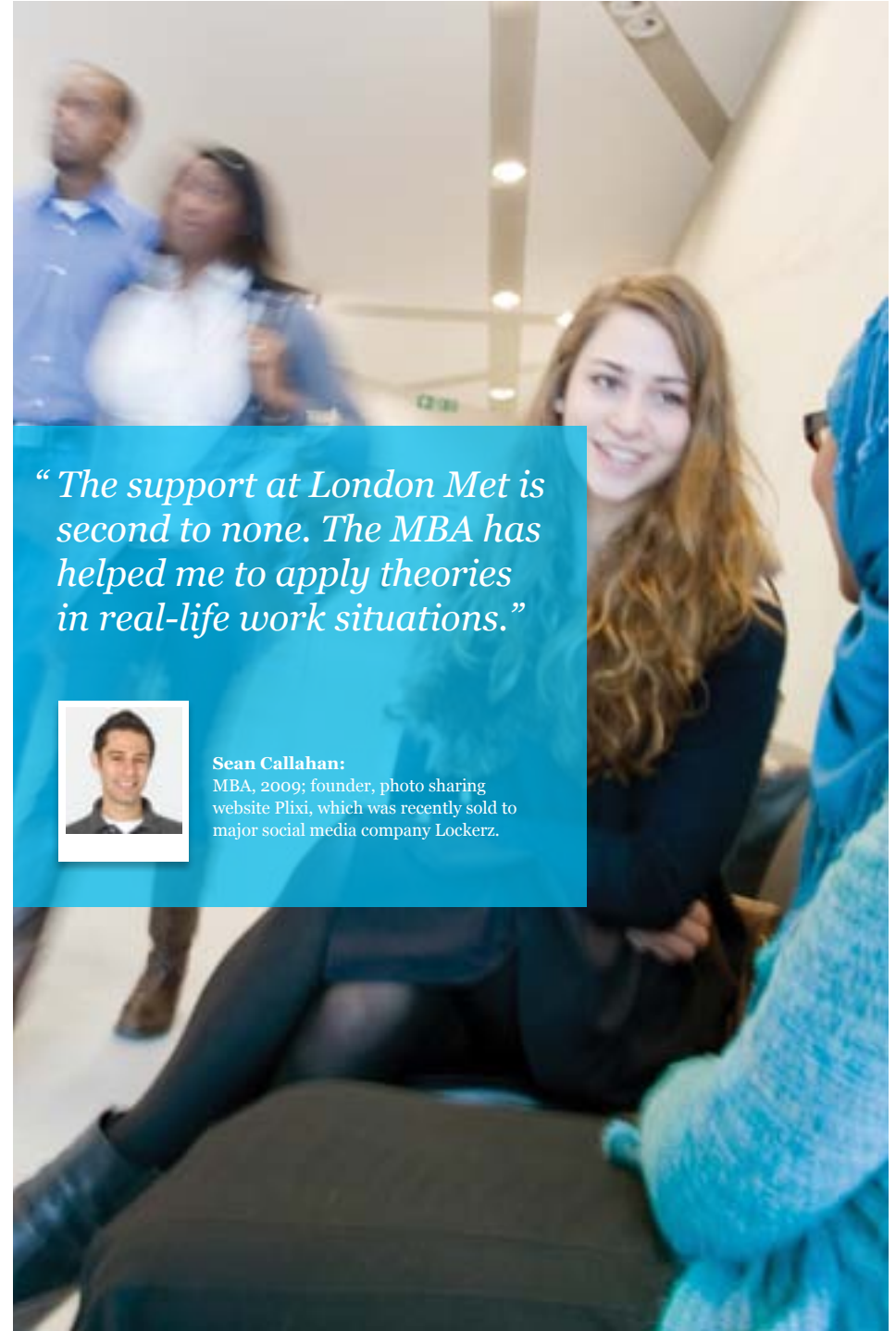
Studying here

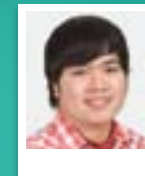

If you are from the UK or the EU, you can apply for a student loan for tuition fees and, sometimes, for living costs.

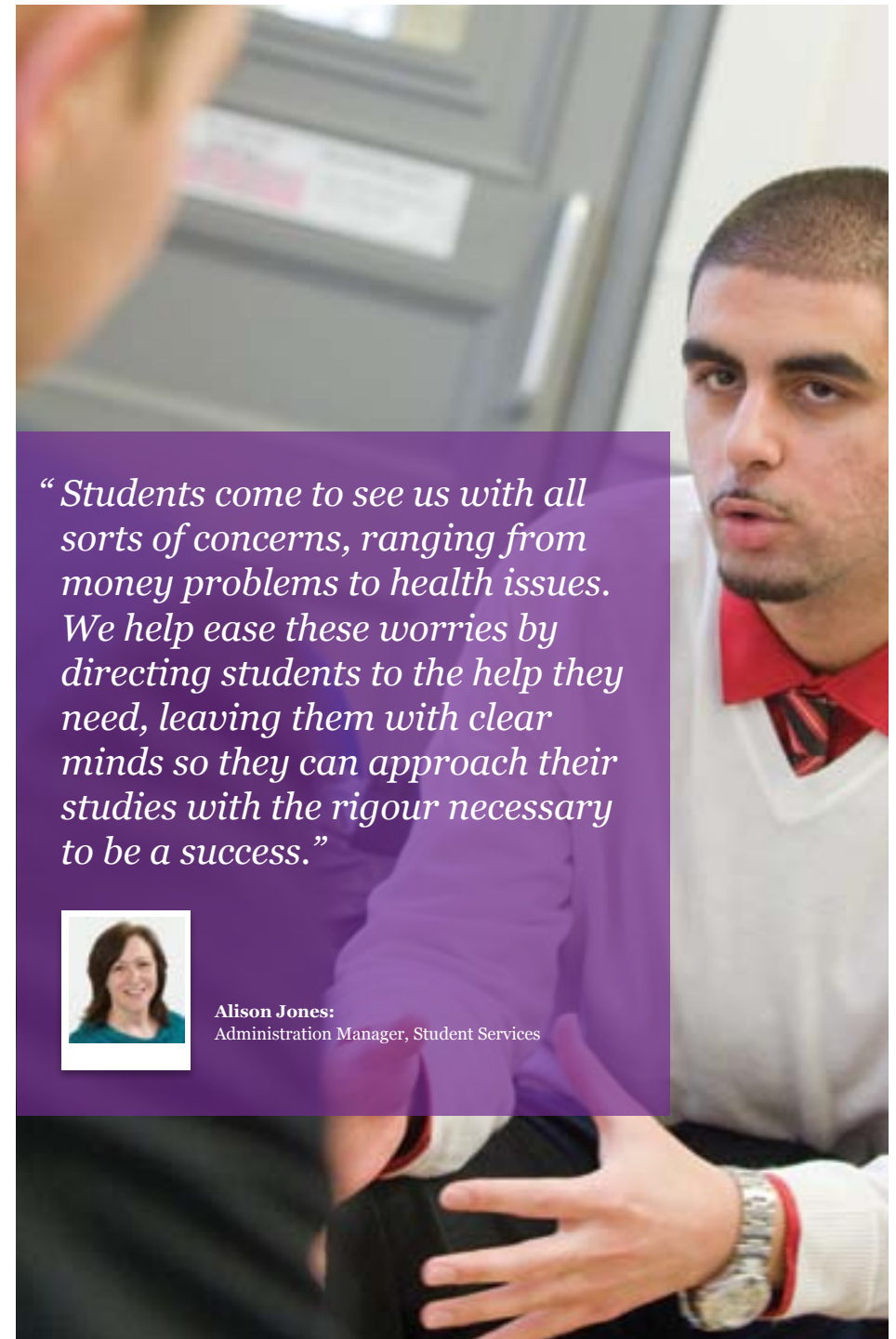
There are also grants and bursaries for which you may be eligible.
