Career History

Mark Robson is head of the Bank of England's statistics division and honorary treasurer of the Royal Economic Society. He joined the Bank in 1995 from the OECD in Paris where he was principal tax economist. During that time he has also been Treasurer and Fellow of Lady Margaret Hall, Oxford University and honorary treasurer of the Royal Statistical Society (2003-7) and an IMF Expert Advisor to the Royal Thai Finance Ministry (1998-9). Previously he was in turn a mathematics tutor, HM Inspector of Taxes, Government Economic Adviser and senior manager with KPMG. He was appointed to the Council of City University London in 2002.

His degrees are from Saint John's College, Oxford and he is a Chartered Mathematician, Scientist and Management Accountant. He is a member of the governing councils of the Institute for Fiscal Studies, the Centre for Study of Financial Innovation and the City of London Academy Islington, and is a Liveryman of the Worshipful Company of International Bankers. In 2010 he was appointed to the Economic and Social Research Council's grants assessment panel.

He was appointed to the University's Board of Governors in April 2010, and is currently Vice-Chair of the Board and Chair of the Finance and Resources Committee.
