

Who is it for?

This programme is suitable for you if:

- you are a 2nd or 3rd year university student who wants to experience studying at a British university
- you are a university graduate wanting to improve your English in a specific field of study and perhaps take an internship to improve your career prospects

What will I do?

The programme combines English language learning and subject classes at the university. **A typical programme has 2 parts:**

Part 1 (starting in September or in May)

- English class (15 hours per week)
- British culture class (3 hours per week)

Part 2 (starting in February or in September)

- English class - general or business (2 or 3 hours per week)
- Academic English and study skills class – Learning and Communicating in an Academic Environment (3 hours per week)
- 2 subject classes (6 hours per week)

Internship

If you would like to, and your level of English is at least IELTS 5.5, you can also apply to do an unpaid internship in Part 2 to experience the UK working environment (an additional charge will apply – currently £550)

Where will I live?

You can stay in a private house with an English-speaking host (homestay accommodation) or in Halls of Residence or you can make your own private arrangements. Usually students stay in the homestay accommodation for Part 1. We will send you more information about your options once you have been accepted onto the programme.

How much will it cost?

Using current figures, the approximate cost for your programme (Parts 1 and 2) would be:

- Tuition: £8,980
- Accommodation: £5,000
- Living expenses: £4,000
- **Total costs:** £17,980

We will give you information about how to get student discounts. Living in London does not have to be expensive!

What do I get at the end?

On successful completion of the programme, you will receive an attendance certificate and a transcript of your grades.
