

Irish in Britain Seminar Series 2009

After a decade or so of decline in Irish emigration, the numbers of Irish people coming to Britain have started to rise again in the last eighteen months. It is still too early to say whether this is the beginning of another major wave of Irish migration as witnessed in the 1950s and 1980s. If it is, it is likely to have very different features to previous waves in the context of the current worldwide recession.

The Irish in Britain Seminar Series provides an opportunity for students, researchers and scholars of Irish Studies to debate and disseminate the latest research in the field, in the light of these developments. For over twenty years the Irish Studies Centre has provided a forum for teaching, learning and research and this seminar series is an informal but informative means and opportunity for anyone interested in engaging with current issues and research about the Irish in Britain.
