Who is this course for?

This qualification is aimed at credit controllers, analysts or team leaders who would like to move into more senior roles, or experienced managers who need to consolidate their experience with qualifications.

The Level 5 Diploma allows students to gain essential kowledge of key credit management areas, as well as an opportunity to carry out useful projects at work and learn new skills, e.g report writing, process inprovement, and self-assessment, project management and presentation skills. Additionally it equips them with an increased ability to innovate, lead teams and operate in a complex business environment.

How long does the course last for?

The Level 5 Diploma typically takes students 18 months to two years to complete.

Where will I study?

All classes take place at our new refurbished Moorgate campus with evening classes running from 6pm - 9pm and Saturday classes running from 9.30am - 4.30pm.

How much are the fees?

The Level 5 Diploma is charged at £485 per subject. Please note additional fees are payable direct to the ICM for their student membership and for each assessment undertaken.

How am I assessed?

Assesment on the Level 5 Diploma is mostly by work-based assignment which have optional sections to test students' research and evaluative skills further for merit and distinction grades.

What will I study?

The Level 5 Diploma comprises a range of five compulsory areas:

- Business Strategy (2 units)
- Risk Management (2 units)
- Process Improvement
- · Leadership and Management
- Legal Proceedings and Insolvency

What are the entry requirements?

To gain entry on to the Level 5 Diploma the ICM requires students to have already obtained their Level 3 Diploma.
