## The latest in sustainable energy debated at London Met

The latest innovations and hottest topics in sustainable energy will be deliberated at a high profile event held by London Metropolitan University's Centre for International Business and Sustainability (CIBS) on April 11.

*UK Energy Day 2011: Sustainable Supply* will bring together world leaders in business, government and civil society to debate issues around energy policy, power generation and low-carbon technologies.

Nuclear power will be a key issue, with focus given to the recent earthquake and tsunami in Japan, and events now unfolding across the Middle East and North Africa.

Deputy Director of the CIBS, Vlasios Voudouris, who will be speaking at the event, said: "The UK Energy Day will address the key energy challenges facing the UK in the 21st century."

Other speakers include: Michael Jefferson, the former Secretary General of the World Energy Council; Walter Leal, Research Director at Hamburg University of Applied Sciences; and Jim Skea, Research Director at the UK Energy Research Centre.

The day is aimed at leaders in government, civil society, business, research institution, and the general public who are interested in energy supply, use, efficiency and renewable energy. There will be plenty of opportunity for networking throughout the day.

Led by the Intelligent Energy Agency of the European Commission (EUSEW), *UK Energy Day 2011* is part of a European network of events to promote awareness of sustainable energy at global, regional, local and industrial levels.

The event will also mark the launch of a new Masters course at London Met, an MSc in Sustainable Business, Energy and Finance.
